II. HOD Update from AAPA

My first opportunity to attend an HOD meeting was in 2021. It was very energized with regard to the title change of our profession. Going into this meeting, I became aware of the engagement from Constituent Organizations (CO) and amendments they were moving forward.

Going into the 2022 year, I ask ASEPA members and leaders to evaluate if there are bylaws or resolutions that we want to move forward. For example, ASEPA submits a resolution "to support and recommend Physician Associates being reimbursed for virtual care

health visits at the same rate as in office." Another example could be that ASEPA recommends resolution for "target A1C in patients less than 8%." ASEPA recommends "following treatment guidelines for transgender patients that follows Endocrine Society Guidelines." I share these as examples.

The House Officers and Governance Staff are working diligently to prepare for the HOD in Indianapolis May 20-22, 2022. We continue to make appointments for this leadership year and are grateful to all our fantastic volunteers. There are still opportunities to volunteer for the HOD.
